Many thanks to a Samaritans branch for raising awareness through a presentation, and signing our petition, and to SI clubs in Aberdare, Stafford, Llandudno, Chester and Winchester, who held or supported events particularly for International Women's Day (see some photos on Page 2). Check out the Bar Chart to see the wide UK coverage that Soroptimists and other organizations are achieving – spreading the word on the trafficking of women and girls in particular. We really can't do this without everyone's help, which we value greatly. As people often email to us, and we pass on to you: "keep up the good work!"

RESULT! SI Southend collected 1250 Bras and 150 signatures over IWD weekend





PAO Catherine from SI Southend-on-Sea writes: we had a very successful IWD event on Saturday, 4th March. We a press release that went into our local paper, the Echo, ten days before to say what we would be doing and why and I went on Tony Fisher's show on BBC Essex on Wednesday, 1st March, to say that we would be collecting pre-loved bras in the Royals Shopping Centre on the Saturday. It was also put out on our Facebook page.

We had women coming all day long, bringing their bras signing the petition. We had a visit from our Mayor, Councillor Judith McMahon and our MP, Sir David Amess (see photos). Sir David is always very supportive and he wrote a letter congratulating us and saying he was overwhelmed by the sight of so many bras!

Southend Borough Council held an event in the Civic Centre on Int. Women's Day, 8th March, so we had a stand there as well and collected more bras and signatures.

As a result of that, I was asked to speak to a group of social workers about Soroptimism and particularly our work on anti--trafficking. The talk went well, we gave out the leaflets we had left over from Int. Women's Day. It was apparently World Social Work Day so there was mixture of qualified social workers and a large group of students studying to be social workers and their tutors from Essex University. One of the tutors in particular was very interested and said he would put up posters and have a box for bra collection! So now we have an opening into the university which is really positive.

International Women's Day Events in Chester





SI Chester PAO Anne writes:

On 4th March, SI Chester members were joined by other clubs in the Region at an International Women's Day (IWD) event hosted in the Town Hall by Chester Women's Aid. We were able to have a stand and display boards which attracted considerable attention and a total of 15 potential new members! We, of course, collected signatures throughout the day for the Purple Teardrop Campaign.

On 7th March, Carole Rivers and I represented SI Chester at the Chester University Diversity Festival. We were two of the speakers at the event which was titled 'Be the best you can be' – which we thought was most appropriate. We explained about the global aspects of Soroptimism as well as describing our Club Projects, including the Purple Teardrop Campaign.

Finally, on 12th March, I took part in a Workshop held in the Cathedral – the title reflecting the 2017 theme for IWD, 'Be bold for Change'. The participants all had the opportunity to circulate between the tables and were able to hear directly from each speaker. I described the Purple Teardrop Campaign, which everyone agreed was extremely worthwhile.

Altogether a further 62 signatures for the Campaign were collected during the week.
